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Objectives

The Migrants Take Care project aims at enhancing social inclusion of migrants with low educational level and from a particular disadvantaged background adapted to their needs for cultural, communication and professional trainings. The project's goal is to set the groundwork for further access, participation and enhancing of learning performance of disadvantaged learners and to improve their employment conditions in the Care Service Sector.

Given the growing shortage in this sector, a high proportion of migrants are employed under semi-legal conditions, very often without a training certificate or work license. In order to overcome existing structural barriers and discriminatory practice, the project will develop business partnership with Care Service Providers.

The Migrants Take Care Toolkit will be tailored to the needs of individual low-skilled or low-qualified migrants, with the objective to train and qualify migrants for the Home/Residential Care Service Sector.

The Toolkit includes:

- Skills assessment tools for recognition and validation of skills acquired through informal and non-formal learning and former work experience, including literacy, numeracy and digital training.
- Specific technical and cultural training (e.g. practical care of people, first aid course, national health care system and cultural communication).
- · Work based online course.
- Online handbook: aiming at developing online guideline for careservice providers to support them in recruiting migrant workers and supporting intergration.

Expected Impact

The project is expected to improve the employment opportunities for low-qualified migrants and to enhance the quality of care people who are elderly or disabled. On a long-term view, the project will be of great importance in terms of fighting the social crisis in the European societies.
